## Aspects of Collecting Golf Instruction Booklets

A NEW field of golf collectibles has been explored to produce this bibliography (never before attempted) of golf instruction booklets. To verify all the data the booklets had to be seen and collated, and so the bibliography is effectively a record of the private collection of the author. The book will prove a valuable research tool for golf book collectors. Every booklet is described with a wealth of details not previously available in any golf bibliography. Each booklet's cover is pictured in colour, the image next to its entry, and also its dustjacket where appropriate. Some booklets have multiple authors. Every author is cited next to his respective chapter heading (28 authors are mentioned in one of the items, for instance.) The content of every booklet is fully described with a complete list of its chapters. Naturally, information conventionally required to identify a book is provided: authors, title, subtitle, publisher, place and date of publication, original publication price, cover description with colors used to print it,

type of binding, and when available the Donovan & Murdoch biblio number. WHILE 274 main titles are presented, more than 450 booklets are actually listed. Each has its picture, and as many titles are series of booklets of two to twenty five items this accounts for many illustrations. Most series number twelve items.

TWO alphabetical indexes are provided to help the collector search through the book: a list of authors/contributors and a list of titles, cross-indexed to the same identifying number.
